Food Pantry

Our Food Pantry provides a three day supply of food staples to those in need.





Comprehensive Case Management

Our Family Resource Coordinators assist clients with goal setting, developing an action plan with measurable milestones and ways to cope with barriers.

Emergency Services

Our Emergency Services Program provides emergency assistance with rent, utilities, evictions, medical & prescription needs and also provides emergency shelter for victims of fire or domestic violence.



Delaware Father Program

Through job training, adult education, employment and financial literacy, we help non-custodial parents, especially fathers. to provide for and to strengthen relationships with their children.

Promoting Safe & Stable Families

This program uses a unique family centered intervention process designed to:

- Reduce family crisis & stress
- Increases knowledge of services & resources
- Improve family relationships
- Helps parents to learn a different way of planning

Second Chance Reentry

This statewide program provides Case Management services to incarcerated individuals 6-12 months prior to their release to increase ability to secure employment, housing & transportation & advancement in education.


Community Development & Housing

Community Development Program

The Community Development Program works with targeted communities throughout the State to promote collaboration among residents to help them identify problems and acquire resources to help strengthen their neighborhoods and combat problems such as injustice, crime and drug abuse. This program also operates the free EITC Tax Preparation program from January-April each year.






Housing & Financial Literacy

Stable secure housing is vital to the health and well-being of individuals, families and communities. Our Housing Program offers HUD approved housing counseling to first-time home buyers and also provides foreclosure prevention services to help existing homeowners stay in their homes.

HELP Program

The HELP Program provides air conditioner installations to qualified recipients April through September, and also offers heater repair or replacement from October through March. The program also provides energy



education and energy saving EcoKits to help reduce energy costs.

After School Programs

Our after school programs provide a safe, engaging environment that inspires learning and life enrichment, and promotes academic success, personal growth, healthy social development and life-long learning.

Summer Enrichment Camp

Summer Enrichment Camp is an extension of our after school programs that provides recreation, educational activities, trips, creative arts and nutrition to school aged children in Sussex County, Delaware.





Freedom Schools

The Freedom School Program provides summer and after school enrichment through a research-based, multicultural program model supporting K-12 scholars and their families through five essential components:

- · High quality academic and character building enrichment
- · Parent & family involvement
- · Civic engagement & social action
- Intergenerational servant leadership development
- Nutrition, physical and mental health.

Our goal is to empower children and young adults to excel and believe in their ability to make a difference in themselves, their families, schools and communities.

Employment, Training & Special Services, con't.

Providing programs that target youth, unemployed adults and seniors, to help reduce the impact of poverty on low-income individuals at every stage of their lives.

Adult Culinary Arts Training

The accredited program trains the unemployed, under-employed, dislocated workers, those with disabilities and those seeking a career change in the high demand food service industry. Includes preparation for Serv-Safe Certification and ABC Certification.





Summer & Year Round Youth Employment

Offers summer and year-round employment opportunities, job training and professional development to teens ages 16-18. Youth also receive soft-skills training on interviews, resumes, business etiquette, life skills training, money management and financial literacy, leadership development, asset building, college and career planning.

"Now We're Cooking" Culinary Training

The "Now We're Cooking" vocational foodservice program is a partnership with local school districts to offer culinary arts training to students in grades 9-12, including those with disabilities.

Workforce Development Training

Workforce Development partners with local educational entities to identify eligible candidates for employment training opportunities like CDL, and CNA training and Flagger training.

Senior Community Service Employment


SCSEP targets unemployed adults 55 and over providing job training and subsidized employment with local social service agencies. The goal is for the trainee to gain the experience needed to obtain unsubsidized employment in the business sector.

Senior Companions

Senior Companion program pairs senior volunteers with other seniors who are in need of peer support and relief for primary caregivers. Includes grocery shopping, light meals, transportation and light house-keeping. The most important thing a Senior Companion provides is friendship.

For Year July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2022






